A Slice of the Pie: A New Scratch Night

A Play, A Pie and A Pint are hosting our first in-house Scratch night on **Friday 4 July 2025**. We will be looking to support **four pieces** of new work in their development, with **two directors** working on two new scripts each and an ensemble of **five performers** making their debuts on the PPP stage. This is an exciting opportunity for artists in Scotland to start new relationships with the PPP team. It will also allow PPP to see the work of writers, directors and performers who we have not worked with before.

As part of this scratch night, we are looking for **five performers** to act as part of the ensemble cast, showcasing their creativity and their ability to perform under the tight parameters of a PPP performance.

The **day** on the **4 July** will consist of a **1hr 50min rehearsal** per excerpt at our central Glasgow rehearsal space, followed by a performance that evening at Òran Mór. Each performer will be required to attend a half day on the 4 July for rehearsal, and the evening for the public performances.

In the **evening**, the four excerpts will be performed in front of an **audience** of **artists and members of the public**, with time for an **open discussion** post-performance with the PPP team. The discussion will open with feedback for each play, moving on to discuss the wider process of writing/directing/performing for PPP, and how PPP can best **support theatre-makers** in Scotland. After the discussion, there'll be a chance to grab a drink at the bar and continue to chat.

Note on performances:

We would like to emphasise that the performances **will** be work-in-progress and performed by the cast script-in-hand. There is no expectation of polished work – there will be limited tech, with no set or props and no opportunity for directors and cast to rehearse outside of the allocated time. Please bear this in mind!

We are looking for performers who:

- Are age 18+
- Have never worked with PPP in **any** paid capacity.
- We are particularly interested in performers who identify as Filipino; Southeast Asian; Global Majority; Scots-speakers; and women over the age of 50.

As part of our commitment to Equity's "cast it here" campaign we are opening this opportunity exclusively to Glasgow-based performers, with the exception of actors from the Global Majority whom we recognise are underrepresented in Scottish theatre. Please indicate if you wish to be considered under these terms, particularly if applying from beyond Glasgow.

Prior **self-funded** assistant director placements at PPP will not disqualify you from applying, but priority will be given to those whose work we have not yet been able to see.
